On Monday, January 4th Brenda Goble Baker passed away in Fort Worth, Texas at the age of 70.

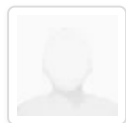


“ I was in class of '68 but moved to Michigan after graduation. A touching obituary of a loving person. I don't recall the name but I know she will
